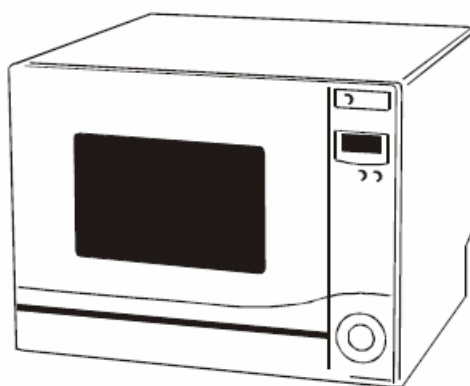

### ELECTRICAL SAFETY

 This appliance complies with Directives 89/336/EEC, 73/23/EEC and following changes.

- **NOTE** - This appliance must be grounded. In the event of a malfunction or breakdown, grounding will reduce the risk of electric shock by providing a path of least resistance of electrical current. You will be able to tell if it is because a non-grounded appliance will give off an electrical discharge.
- IF POWER SUPPLY CORD IS DAMAGED, IT MUST ONLY BE REPLACED BY THE MANUFACTURER OR ITS SERVICE AGENT OR A SIMILARLY QUALIFIED PERSON TO AVOID A HAZARD.
- THIS APPLIANCE IS FITTED WITH A SAFETY FUNCTION THAT AUTOMATICALLY STOPS THE OPERATION OF THE DISHWASHER WHEN IT IS EXPOSED TO ANY HEAVY DISTURBANCE ON ITS MAINS.

## **BEFORE USING YOUR BAUMATIC MINI4 DISHWASHER:**

- **SOME ITEMS ARE UNSUITABLE FOR WASHING IN YOUR DISHWASHER. PLEASE SEE PAGE 9 FOR A LIST OF THESE ITEMS.**
- **DO NOT TAMPER WITH THE CONTROLS.**
- **WHEN LOADING ITEMS TO BE WASHED:**
  - 1) **Keep sharp items like knives away from the door seal.**
  - 2) **Load sharp knives with the handles up to prevent injuries.**
- **DO NOT SPRAY WATER ON THE APPLIANCE. DOING SO MAY CAUSE THE FAILURE OF ELECTRICAL PARTS OR ELECTRIC SHOCK.**
- **THE APPLIANCE IS TO BE CONNECTED TO THE WASH MAINS USING NEW HOSE-SETS. OLD HOSE-SETS SHOULD NOT BE RE-USED.**
- **THE DISHWASHER SHOULD BE CONNECTED TO THE COLD WATER SUPPLY ONLY. NOTE THAT THE TEMPERATURE OF THE WATER COMING INTO YOUR DISHWASHER WILL AFFECT THE TIMES OF YOUR DISHWASHER'S CYCLES. THIS SHOULD BE BY A NEGLIBLE AMOUNT, OWING TO THE DIFFERENCES IN THE TEMPERATURES OF WATER MAINS FROM PLACE TO PLACE AND AT THE TIME OF YEAR.**
- **DO NOT USE THE DISHWASHER FOR INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL USE, OR ANY OTHER PURPOSES.**
- **THIS DISHWASHER IS DESIGNED FOR NORMAL HOUSEHOLD USE ONLY**
- **ONLY USE AUTOMATIC DISHWASHER DETERGENT, NOT SOAP OR LAUNDRY DETERGENT. NEVER USE SOLVENTS AS THIS COULD RESULT IN AN EXPLOSION!**

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## **DURING USE**

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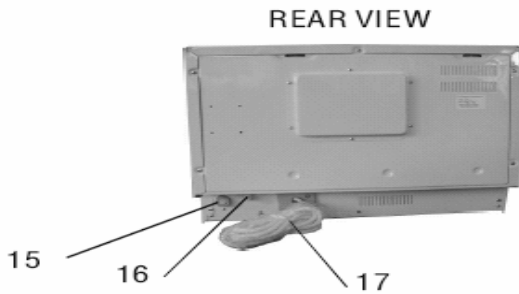
- **DO NOT USE THE DETERGENT FOR HAND WASHING. THE DETERGENT FOR THE DISHWASHER SHOULD BE USED FOR NORMAL OPERATION OF THE APPLIANCE ONLY.**

**DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR WHEN THE LCD DISPLAY READS: 'HIGH TEMPERATURE.' THE HOT STEAM MAY CAUSE PERSONAL INJURY.**

## **AFTER USE**

- **ALWAYS KEEP THE DOOR CLOSED TO AVOID DANGER OF TRIPPING.**
- **CHECK THAT THE DETERGENT DISPENSER IS EMPTY AFTER COMPLETION OF WASH CYCLE.**
- **IF LEAVING UNUSED FOR A LONG TIME, DISCONNECT THE WATER SUPPLY (SEE PAGE 20).**

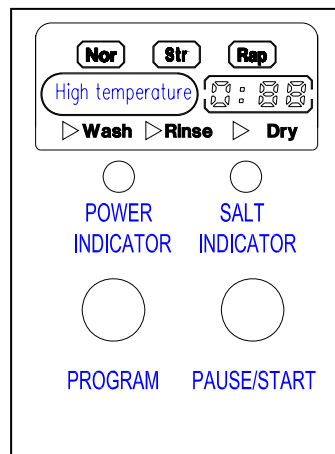
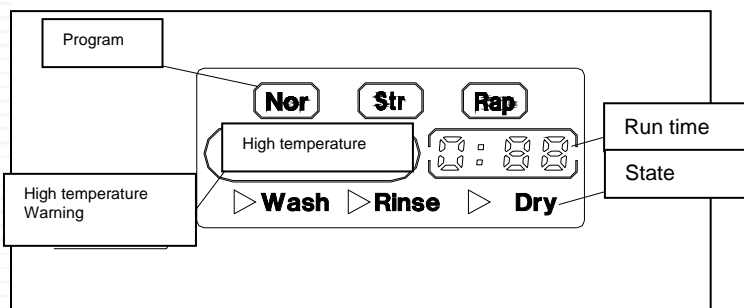
Your MINI 4 Dishwasher

1. The power indicator: it will light up when the machine comes on.
2. The salt indicator: it will light up when the salt runs low in the softener container.

runs low in the softener container. Please add more salt to the container (see p.6) if the salt indicator light comes on.

3. Program Key: you can select the program by pushing the program key;
4. Pause/Start key: you can start or pause the program by pushing the Pause/Start key;

**Note on chemicals used by your dishwasher:**

Your dishwasher is equipped with rinse aid and water softening dispensers. Using detergent, rinse aid and salt individually will give the best possible results as this will give the correct dosage of each chemical to suit your needs.

- *Using Two-in-One or Three-in-One tablets may not give the best results when used in your appliance, and may not be suitable for the type of water supply in your home, as they contain pre-determined quantities of salt, rinse aid and detergent and cannot be adjusted to the individual requirements.*
- *If you are going to use 3-in-1 (or 2-in-1) tablets, we suggest that you contact the manufacturer before use or if you experience poor results in the wash performance and ask for assistance from them.*

**WARNING:**

IF YOU USE 3-IN-1 OR 2-IN-1 TABLETS, BE SURE NOT TO ADD SALT AND/OR RINSE AID TO THE APPLIANCE AS THESE TABLET TYPES ALREADY CONTAIN SALT AND/OR

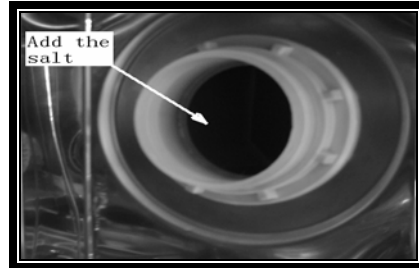
RINSE AID. **ADDING SALT AND RINSE AID TO YOUR DISHWASHER'S COMPARTMENTS IN A CYCLE INVOLVING A 3-IN-1 OR 2-IN-1 TABLET WILL RESULT IN OVERDOSING OF INDIVIDUAL CHEMICALS AND MAY CAUSE OVERFLOWING OF WATER AND SUDS.**

**YOUR DISHWASHER'S WATER SOFTENING FEATURE**

**HOW TO USE THE WATER SOFTENER.**

THE HARDNESS OF THE WATER VARIES FROM PLACE TO PLACE. IF HARD WATER IS USED IN THE DISHWASHER, DEPOSITS WILL FORM ON THE DISHES AND UTENSILS. YOUR DISHWASHER IS EQUIPPED WITH A WATER SOFTENER WHICH USES A SALT SPECIFICALLY DESIGNED TO ELIMINATE THE MINERALS FROM THE WATER THAT WOULD OTHERWISE LEAVE DEPOSITS ON YOUR DISHES AFTER WASHING.

***YOUR WATER SOFTENER'S SALT CONTAINER NEEDS TO BE LOADED WITH DISHWASHER SALT BEFORE YOU USE YOUR DISHWASHER FOR THE FIRST TIME. PLEASE FOLLOW THESE DIRECTIONS FOR OPTIMUM PERFORMANCE:***



**LOADING THE SALT INTO THE CONTAINER.**

- 1) UNSCREW THE CAP FROM THE SALT CONTAINER ANTICLOCKWISE. THE CONTAINER IS ON THE RIGHT HAND SIDE OF THE INNER BOX.
- 2) LOAD THE SALT INTO THE CONTAINER. EACH TIME YOU MAY LOAD 250G OF SALT, WHICH CAN BE USED FOR 15 CYCLES.
- 3) FILL THE WATER INTO THE SALT CONTAINER UNTIL A SMALL AMOUNT OF WATER COMES OUT (THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT WHEN YOU USE IT FOR THE FIRST TIME).
- 4) SCREW THE CAP BACK ON CAREFULLY.

**NOTE:**

- 1) **LOAD THE SALT BEFORE THE BEGINNING OF A WASH CYCLE SO AS TO PREVENT CORROSION.**
- 2) **USE ONLY DISHWASHER SALT. OTHER TYPES OF SALT CAN DO IRREPARABLE DAMAGE TO YOUR APPLIANCE.**

**USING A RINSE AID**

***YOU CAN HELP PREVENT UNSIGHTLY SPOTS ON DISHES AND GLASSWARE, AND REDUCE DRYING TIME BY USING RINSE AID. A RINSE AID IS SPECIALLY FORMULATED TO RINSE AWAY***

**FOOD AND DETERGENT RESIDUES THAT CAN BE LEFT BEHIND ON YOUR DISHES. USED REGULARLY, RINSE AID WILL AUTOMATICALLY PROVIDE YOU WITH CLEANER DISHES EVERY TIME YOU WASH.**

- TO FILL THE RINSE AID DISPENSER, UNSCREW THE DISPENSER CAP LOCATED AT THE BACK OF THE INNER BOX AT THE TOP RIGHT.
- ADD THE RINSE AGENT SLOWLY INTO THE CONTAINER UNTIL IT JUST REACHES THE BOTTOM OF THE FILLING CAP INSIDE THE DISPENSER OPENING.
- REPLACE THE CAP.
- THE DISPENSER AUTOMATICALLY RELEASES THE RINSE AID INTO THE FINAL RINSE WATER.



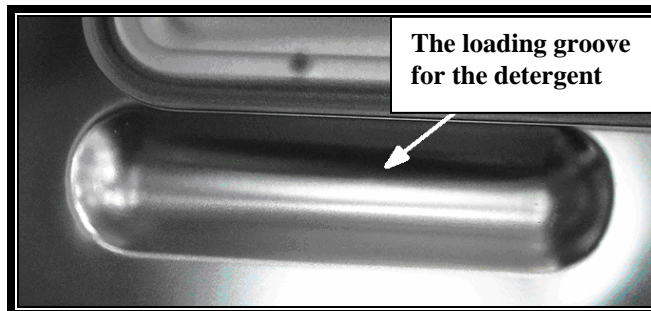
## **USING DETERGENT IN YOUR DISHWASHER**

### ***USING THE RIGHT DETERGENT***

USE ONLY DETERGENT SPECIFICALLY MADE FOR USE IN DISHWASHERS, AS OTHER TYPES WILL CAUSE OVERSUDSING AND FROTHING. IF YOUR DETERGENT IS OLD AND/OR LUMPY, THROW IT AWAY. OLD DETERGENT LOSES ITS WASHING POWER. LUMPY DETERGENT WON'T DISSOLVE.

### **HOW MUCH DETERGENT SHOULD YOU USE?**

- THIS DEPENDS ON IF YOUR WATER IS 'HARD' OR 'SOFT'.
- HARDER WATER REQUIRES MORE DETERGENT TO GET DISHES CLEAN
- SOFT WATER REQUIRES LESS DETERGENT TO GET DISHES CLEAN.



- THE DETERGENT LOADING GROOVE (pictured above) ON THE INSIDE DOOR PANEL WILL HOLD APPROX. 7 GRAMS OF DETERGENT. ALWAYS FOLLOW THE DETERGENT MANUFACTURER'S GUIDELINES.

**BEFORE YOU LOAD YOUR DISHWASHER,**  
MAKE SURE THAT YOUR DISHWASHER IS CONNECTED TO THE COLD WATER SUPPLY.  
CHECK THAT THE FILTER (ITEM 11 IN THE DIAGRAM ON PAGE 5) IS SECURELY IN PLACE.

## **LOADING YOUR DISHWASHER**

*PUSH THE DOOR RELEASE BUTTON (ITEM 3 ON DIAGRAM ON PAGE 5) TO OPEN THE DOOR.*

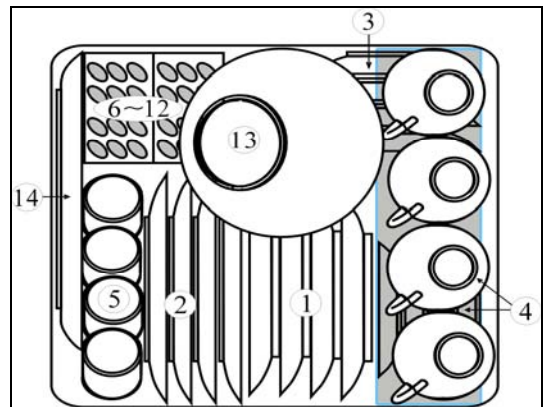
**NOTE:**

FOR BEST PERFORMANCE, FOLLOW THESE LOADING GUIDELINES. FEATURES AND APPEARANCE OF RACK & CUTLERY BASKET MAY VARY FROM YOUR MODEL.

**IMPORTANT:** CLEAN OFF LARGE FOOD SEDIMENTS BEFORE PLACING DISHES IN THE DISHWASHER. GET RID OF AS MUCH SAUCE AND GREASE AS POSSIBLE AND EMPTY CUPS & GLASSES.

**YOUR DISHWASHER IS DESIGNED TO RECEIVE A STANDARD '4 PIECE' PLACE SETTING CONSISTING OF THE FOLLOWING:**

1. 4 DINNER PLATES
2. 4 BREAD & BUTTER PLATES
3. 4 FRUIT BOWLS
4. 4 CUPS AND SAUCERS
5. 4 GLASS CUPS
6. 4 DINNER FORKS
7. 4 DINNER KNIVES
8. 4 SALAD FORKS
9. 4 TEASPOONS
10. 2 SERVING SPOONS
11. 1 SERVING SPOON
12. 1 SERVING FORK
13. 1 SERVING BOWL
14. 1 OVAL PLATTER



**NOTE:**

FOR EASE OF LOADING / UNLOADING LARGE SIZE DINNER PLATES FROM THE DISH RACK, YOU MIGHT HAVE TO (TEMPORARILY) REMOVE THE CUTLERY BASKET. WHEN LOADING / UNLOADING IS COMPLETE, RETURN THE CUTLERY BASKET TO ITS ORIGINAL POSITION.

**PREPARING YOUR DISHES FOR WASHING:**

**NOTE: DISHES WITH DRIED-ON FOODS ARE MORE DIFFICULT TO WASH AND MAY NOT COME OUT CLEAN FROM A NORMAL WASH CYCLE.**

**WHEN LOADING ITEMS TO BE WASHED:**

**Note:**

**Do not wash stainless steel and silver cutlery together. Iron objects can rust and stain other items. Aluminium tends to go black. Copper, pewter & brass stain.**

**NOTE:**

- **WHEN YOU ARE SATISFIED YOU HAVE LOADED ALL THE UTENSILS AND DISHES YOU WANT TO WASH AND HAVE ADDED THE PROPER AMOUNT OF DETERGENT TO THE DISPENSER, ENSURE THE RACK IS PUSHED ALL THE WAY BACK INTO YOUR DISHWASHER AND CLOSE THE DOOR.**
- **YOU ARE NOW READY TO START A WASH CYCLE (SEE NEXT PAGE).**
- **CHECK TO MAKE SURE THAT THE ROTATING SPRAY ARM CAN TURN FREELY ALL THE WAY ROUND. IF NECESSARY, REMOVE ANYTHING BLOCKING IT.**

## **STARTING A WASH CYCLE – OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS**

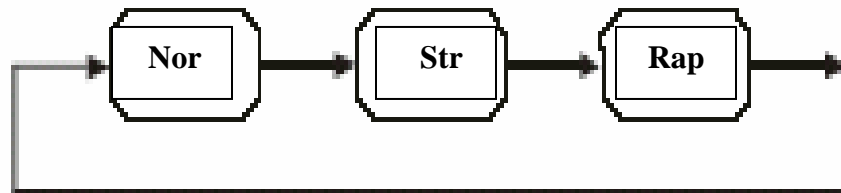
TO USE YOUR DISHWASHER:

1. CHECK THAT THE INLET AND DRAIN HOSES ARE CORRECTLY AND SECURELY CONNECTED.
2. CLOSE THE DOOR FIRMLY.
3. OPEN THE WATER SUPPLY.
4. PUSH THE POWER (ON/OFF) BUTTON.

PUSH BUTTON IN = POWER ON  
PUSH SO BUTTON IS OUT = POWER OFF

THE LCD AND THE POWER LIGHT WILL NOW ILLUMINATE INDICATING THE MACHINE IS RECEIVING POWER.

5. *NOW SELECT THE DESIRED PROGRAM BY PRESSING THE PROGRAM KEY. THE LCD WILL DISPLAY THE WASHING MODE YOU SELECTED.*



6. PRESS THE PAUSE/START KEY TO START. THE LCD WILL FLASH THE PROGRAM AND THE WASHING STATUS DURING OPERATION.
7. AT THE END OF THE CYCLE, THE DISHWASHER WILL STOP AND THE LCD WILL STOP FLASHING AND THE DISHWASHER WILL BEEP. NOTE: THE LCD WILL BE BLACK WHEN THE MACHINE DOES NOT RUN OR OPERATE FOR MORE THAN 10 MINUTES. THE POWER LIGHT WILL STAY LIT UNTIL THE POWER (ON/OFF) BUTTON IS SWITCHED OFF.
8. THE DISHWASHER IS DESIGNED TO STOP IF THE DOOR IS OPENED ACCIDENTALLY DURING OPERATION.
9. YOU CAN SELECT ANOTHER PROGRAM DURING OPERATION BY PRESSING THE PAUSE/START KEY FIRST, THEN PRESSING THE PROGRAM KEY TO THE DESIRED PROGRAM, AND PRESSING THE PAUSE/START KEY TO START. PLEASE NOTE THAT YOU HAVE A LIMITED TIME TO CHANGE TO ANOTHER PROGRAM BEFORE YOUR DISHWASHER BECOMES SET ON THE OLD PROGRAM.
10. AFTER WASHING, DISHES SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO COOL DOWN FOR ABOUT 15 MINUTES SO THEY ARE NOT TOO HOT TO HANDLE. DISHES WILL COOL QUICKER IF THE DOOR IS OPENED SLIGHTLY.

**11. AFTER UNLOADING THE DISWASHER, REMOVE THE FILTER, CLEAN OFF ANY BITS OF FOOD, AND PUT THE FILTER BACK IN ITS POSITION.**

**NOTE:** AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH CYCLE, THE DISHWASHER ALWAYS STARTS IN THE 'DRAIN' MODE. THIS IS BECAUSE THE DRAIN PUMP ALWAYS RETAINS A SMALL AMOUNT OF WATER (IN THE SUMP) FROM THE PREVIOUS CYCLE. THIS IS NECESSARY TO KEEP THE PUMP PRIMED. THEREFORE, DO NOT BE ALARMED IF YOU SEE A SMALL AMOUNT OF WATER BEING PUMPED-OUT FROM THE DRAIN HOSE PRIOR TO THE START OF THE REGULAR WASH CYCLE. THIS IS NORMAL.

## **THESE ARE THE PROGRAM CYCLES:**

<b>PROGRAM TYPE</b>	<b>WATER TEMPERATURE</b>	<b>PROGRAM DURATION &amp; HEATING TIME</b>	<b>WATER USED</b>
STRONG WASH	62°C	75 MINS.	14 LITRES
NORMAL WASH	62°C	67 MINS.	12 LITRES
RAPID WASH	55°C	35 MINS.	6 LITRES

**(NOTE:** THE WASHING TIME MAY VARY ACCORDING TO THE INCOMING WATER TEMPERATURE AND THE ENVIRONMENTAL TEMPERATURE. FOR EXAMPLE, A NORMAL WASHING CYCLE OF 67°C HAS BEEN RECORDED TO LAST FOR 78 MINS.)

## **FILTERING SYSTEM**

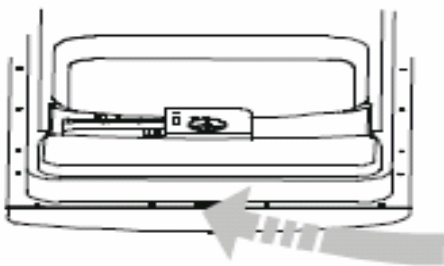
**FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE, WE HAVE PLACED THE FILTERING SYSTEM WITHIN EASY REACH INSIDE THE TUB. THE FILTER REMOVES BITS OF FOOD TRAPPED IN THE FILTER FROM THE WASH WATER SO IT CAN BE RECIRCULATED DURING THE CYCLE. THERE ARE THREE PARTS TO THE FILTERING SYSTEM:**

- 1) THE STAINLESS STEEL MICRO FILTER - LOCATED AT THE BOTTOM OF THE INNER BOX. THIS PERFORATED STAINLESS STEEL PLATE TRAPS LARGE PARTICLES OF FOOD THAT WOULD OTHERWISE BE RECIRCULATED AROUND WITH THE DISHWATER DURING A CYCLE.
- 2) THE CONICAL FILTER. THIS IS THE FIRST CIRCULAR-SHAPED FILTER THAT LIES IMMEDIATELY IN THE HOLE OF THE MICROFILTER PLATE. THIS WILL TRAP LARGE PIECES OF FOOD, ETC.
- 3) THE FINE MESH FILTER. THIS IS THE SECOND CIRCULAR-SHAPED FILTER THAT LIES ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE COARSE FILTER. IT CATCHES AND TRAPS FINER DEBRIS FROM THE WASH WATER AS IT TRAVELS THROUGH THE FILTERING SYSTEM, ENABLING THE WASH WATER TO STAY FREE OF FOOD RESIDUES.

## *Caring for your Dishwasher*

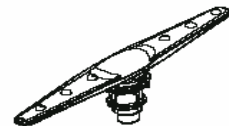
### *CLEANING THE OUTSIDE SURFACES OF YOUR APPLIANCE*

- TO CLEAN THE EXTERIOR OF YOUR DISHWASHER (INCLUDING THE CONTROL PANEL), USE A LIGHTLY DAMPENED CLOTH THEN DRY THOROUGHLY. **NEVER USE SHARP OBJECTS, SCOURING PADS OR HARSH CLEANERS ON ANY PART OF THE APPLIANCE. SOME PAPER TOWELS CAN SCRATCH.**



- TO CLEAN THE EDGE AROUND THE DOOR, ONLY EVER USE A SOFT WARM, DAMP RAG. DO NOT USE A SPRAY CLEANER HERE OR WHEN CLEANING THE DOOR PANEL AS THIS MAY HARM THE DOOR LOCK AND ELECTRICAL PARTS.

## ***CLEANING THE SPRAY ARMS***



THE SPRAY ARMS NEED REGULAR CLEANING AS HARD WATER RESIDUES WILL CLOG THEIR JETS & BEARINGS. TO REMOVE THE SPRAY ARM, SCREW OFF THE NUT TO TAKE OUT THE WASHER ON TOP OF THE SPRAY ARM AND REMOVE THE ARM. WASH THE ARMS IN SOAPY WARM WATER & USE A SOFT BRUSH TO CLEAN THE JETS. REPLACE THE SPRAY ARM AFTER RINSING IT THOROUGHLY.

## ***CLEANING THE FILTERS***

- THE FILTER ASSEMBLY MUST BE KEPT CLEAN FOR BEST PERFORMANCE. You should remove the larger bits of food trapped in the filter after each wash cycle by rinsing them under running water. **To remove the filter assembly, pull up on the cup handle.**
- ***The entire filter assembly should be cleaned at least once a month.***
- To clear the coarse filter and the fine filter, use a cleaning brush. Then, reassemble the filter parts as shown in the figure above and reinsert the entire assembly in the dishwasher in its seat & press downward to secure it.
- Improper replacement of the filter may impair appliance performance and damage dishes and utensils.

- ***Warning - never run the dishwasher **without the filters** in place!***
- ***Warning - Before cleaning the inner cavity of the appliance always allow 15 minutes for the Element to cool down to avoid injury!***

## **HOW TO KEEP YOUR DISHWASHER IN SHAPE**

**AFTER EVERY WASH**, leave the door slightly ajar so that moisture and odours are not trapped inside.

**REMOVE THE PLUG** before cleaning or performing maintenance. Never run the risk of electric shocks.

**DO NOT USE SOLVENTS OR ABRASIVE CLEANING AGENTS** to clean the exterior and the rubber parts of the dishwasher. Only use a cloth and warm soapy water. To remove spots or stains from the surface of the interior, use a cloth dampened with water and a little white vinegar, or a cleaning product made specifically for dishwashers.

**WHEN YOU GO ON HOLIDAY**, run a wash cycle with the dishwasher empty. Then unplug it, turn off the water supply and leave the door slightly ajar to prevent odours and mould from developing.

**MOVING THE APPLIANCE** is possible but KEEP IT UPRIGHT.

**SEALS** can trap food, which in turn will cause odours. Periodic cleaning with a damp cloth or sponge will prevent this from becoming a problem.

**PROTECTING YOUR DISHWASHER AGAINST FREEZING**

*If your dishwasher is left in an unheated place during the winter, ask a service technician to:*

- 1) Cut off electrical power to the dishwasher. Remove fuses or trip circuit breaker.
- 2) Turn off the water supply and disconnect the water inlet pipe from the water valve & discharge hoses.
- 3) Drain water from the inlet pipe and water valve (Use a pan to catch the water).
- 4) Reconnect the water inlet pipe to the water valve.
- 5) Remove the plastic sump cover in the tub bottom and use a sponge to soak up water in the rubber boot.

YOU NEED AN ELECTRICAL SUPPLY OF 220-240 VOLTS ONLY, 50HZ.

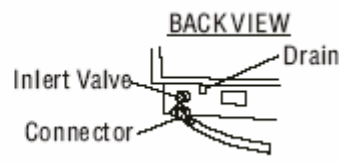
MAKE SURE YOU HAVE A SUITABLE ELECTRICAL SUPPLY SOCKET CLOSE TO WHERE YOU WANT TO PLACE THE DISHWASHER. FOR YOUR PERSONAL SAFETY, THE APPLIANCE MUST BE EARTHED. THE APPLIANCE IS EQUIPPED WITH A POWER SUPPLY CORD HAVING A 3-PIN GROUNDING PLUG. TO MINIMIZE POSSIBLE SHOCK

HAZARDS, IT MUST BE PLUGGED INTO A MATCHING 3-PIN GROUNDING TYPE ELECTRICAL OUTLET.

IF THE MAINS PLUG IS UNSUITABLE FOR THE SOCKET OUTLET IN YOUR HOME OR IS REMOVED FOR ANY OTHER REASON, THEN THE CUT OFF PLUG SHOULD BE DISPOSED OF SAFELY TO PREVENT THE HAZARD OF ELECTRIC SHOCK.

## INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. REMOVE ALL PACKING MATERIALS CAREFULLY
2. THE WATER INLET HOSE FROM THE MACHINE ENDS IN A 3/4" FEMALE CONNECTOR (IE. - TUBE/HOLE/SOCKET OPENING). THE WATER SUPPLY SHOULD THEREFORE END IN A SIMILAR MALE CONNECTOR (IE. – PIPE / PRONG ENDED) AND THERE SHOULD BE A STOPCOCK CLOSE BY IN THE PIPE.  
YOU SHOULD CONNECT THE STRAIGHT CONNECTOR OF THE INLET HOSE TO THE WATER SUPPLY SECURELY. CONNECT THE OTHER END (BENT CONNECTOR) TO THE WATER INLET VALVE AT THE BACK OF THE DISHWASHER CABINET. DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN OR YOU WILL DAMAGE THE THREADS.
3. PREPARE THE DRAINAGE HOSE SO IT HAS A HOOKED END. USE THE PLASTIC U-BEND FITTING PROVIDED FOR THIS PURPOSE. THE END OF THIS SHOULD BE DROPPED INTO A DRAINAGE STANDPIPE. THIS STANDPIPE SHOULD BE NO MORE THAN 6" ABOVE THE BASE OF THE DISHWASHER. TO ALLOW FOR AN AIR GAP AROUND THE END OF THE DRAIN HOSE, THE DIAMETER OF THE STANDPIPE SHOULD BE AT LEAST 30MM. CONNECT THE OTHER END OF THE DRAIN HOSE (L-SHAPED) TO THE DRAIN PORT CONNECTION AT THE BACK OF THE DISHWASHER CABINET (SEE PAGE 5). TIGHTEN THE DRAIN HOSE END ON TO THE DRAIN PORT USING THE METAL CLIP INCLUDED IN THE PACKAGE.
4. IF YOU WANT, YOU CAN CONNECT THE WATER INLET HOSE TO THE KITCHEN SINK TAP. YOU MUST OBTAIN CORRECT FITTINGS / ADAPTORS TO MATCH THE INLET HOSE CONNECTORS TO ENSURE A SECURE CONNECTION. HOWEVER, PERMANENT PLUMBING IS RECOMMENDED.



5. IF YOU FIND A LEAK, SHUT THE WATER SUPPLY OFF IMMEDIATELY AND CHECK THE HOSE CONNECTIONS FULLY. TIGHTEN CONNECTIONS, IF NEEDS BE.
6. IF FOR ANY REASON YOU ARE UNABLE TO STOP THE LEAK YOURSELF, PLEASE SEEK ADVICE FROM A QUALIFIED PLUMBER.
7. THE MINIMUM HEIGHT CLEARANCE REQUIRED TO INSTALL YOUR DISHWASHER ON A COUNTERTOP SURFACE WITH OVERHEAD CUPBOARDS IS 19" (48CM).
8. MAKE SURE THERE IS AN ELECTRICAL POWER SUPPLY WITHIN EASY REACH OF THE MACHINE. THE POWER CORD IS 6 FEET (182.8CM) LONG.
9. THE DISHWASHER MUST BE INSTALLED ON A 'SOLID' LEVEL SURFACE.
10. TO LEVEL THE DISHWASHER, ADJUST THE 4 LEVEL SCREWS (FEET) UNDER THE DISHWASHER.

## **WATER PRESSURE**

FOR BEST OPERATING RESULTS, INCOMING WATER PRESURE SHOULD BE BETWEEN **0.5** AND **10 BAR**. INCOMING WATER SUPPLY FOR THE DISHWASHER IS CONTROLLED BY A 'PRESSURE SWITCH' APPLICATION, SO IF THE WATER PRESSURE IN YOUR HOME IS LOW, THE DISHWASHER WILL TAKE LONGER TO FILL WITH WATER.

**WARNING: DO NOT CONNECT YOUR MINI 4 TO A HOT TAP!**

### **FOR BEST RESULTS:**

YOUR DISHWASHER CLEANS BY SPRAYING A MIXTURE OF HOT CLEAN WATER AND DETERGENT (UNDER PRESSURE) AGAINST THE SOILED SURFACE OF DISHES. THE WATER IS PUMPED THROUGH A ROTATING SPRAY ARM, DRAINED THROUGH A FILTER REMOVING FOOD AND SOILED PARTICLES AND PUMPED BACK THROUGH THE SPRAY ARM.

SOILED WATER IS PUMPED OUT AND REPLACED WITH CLEAN WATER AT THE END OF EACH CYCLE (THE NUMBER OF TIMES DEPENDS ON THE CYCLE BEING USED). FOR BEST CLEANING RESULTS, THE WATER TEMPERATURE MUST BE AT LEAST 130<sup>o</sup>F (55<sup>o</sup>C). TO PREVENT DISHWASHER DAMAGE, THE TEMPERATURE OF THE INCOMING WATER SUPPLY **SHOULD NEVER EXCEED 160<sup>o</sup>F (71<sup>o</sup>C).**

**NOTE:** HARD WATER CONDITIONS WILL REDUCE THE PERFORMANCE EFFECTIVENESS AND ABILITY OF YOUR DISHWASHER. HARD WATER CONDITIONS WILL ALSO

## **DISCONNECTING YOUR DISHWASHER**

- CLOSE THE WATER SUPPLY AT THE STOPCOCK.
- DISCONNECT THE POWER SUPPLY CORD.
- DISCONNECT THE INLET HOSE ASSEMBLY FROM THE WATER SUPPLY. WHEN THE DISHWASHER IS NOT IN USE, PLACE/STORE THE HOSE ON THE HANGER HOSE BRACKET LOCATED ON THE REAR WALL OF THE DISHWASHER CABINET.

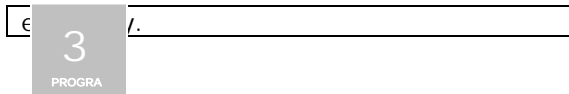
